- Bullying in School & out of School
- Vandalism or graffiti
- Playing music too loudly
- Shouting, screaming or swearing
- Drinking alcohol
- Violence or threats of violence
- Drug Misuse
- Playing Truant
- Verbal Abuse
- Dropping Litter
- Blocking entrance ways
- Spitting

What are Acceptable Behaviour Contracts (ABCs)?

- Written Agreement
- Police, Comhairle and sometimes School
- Stopping or Reducing antisocial acts
- Reminding people what they can and can't do



Acceptable Behaviour Contracts (ABCs)

Who can get them?

Any person who's behaviour has been identified as unacceptable.

Acceptable Behaviour Contracts (ABCs)

What can happen if the agreement is broken?

You may have to attend court where a Sheriff might serve an Antisocial Behaviour Order

(ASBO)



Action That Can Be Taken

- Warning letter
- Warning meeting
- Unacceptable Behaviour Notice
- Acceptable Behaviour Contract
- Referral to Children's Reporter
- Fixed Penalty Notices for ASB
- Seizure of cars, stereos and other offending equipment (motorbikes etc)
- Disconnection of land line and mobile phones for abusive, bullying, hoax or silent calls
- ASBO / CrASBO.
