



Non-Domestic Rates

The amount of non domestic rates you pay is based on the rateable value placed on your property by the Assessor and multiplied by the rate per pound announced each year by the Scottish Government.

A range of exemptions and reliefs are available. Further information is available on the back of your bill, our website (www.cne-siar.gov.uk) or you can contact us on 01851 822645. Collection of Council Tax

If you fall behind with your payments we will send you a reminder that will give you 7 days to bring your payments up to date. If you do not pay you will lose the right to continue to pay by instalments and the full amount for the rest of the year becomes due.

No further reminders will be sent to you and we will apply to the Sheriff for a Summary Warrant which will add a Statutory Penalty of 10% of the amount outstanding onto your bill. We may then pass this to our Sheriff Officers for collection and this could be through an arrestment of your wages or your bank account. Any additional Sheriff Officer expenses incurred are also payable by you in addition to the 10% surcharge.

Waste and Sewerage Charges

Council Tax bills include charges made by Scottish Water for Water and Sewerage services. Whilst the Council is required by law to include these charges in its bills, it is not responsible for setting them. The level of the charges is set by Scottish Water and is subject to scrutiny by the Water Industry Commissioner for Scotland and the Scottish Government.

Council Tax

Council Tax is normally payable by the resident owner(s) or resident tenant(s) of a domestic property. Husbands and wives, couples living together, joint owners/tenants have joint liability for the Council Tax. Comhairle Nan Eilean Siar is required by law to bill and collect Council Tax, along with Water and Sewerage charges on behalf of Scottish Water (if you are connected to water and sewerage systems provided by Scottish Water).

Council Tax is normally payable by 10 monthly instalments over the months April to January and unless you have a special arrangement, or pay by direct debit, payment is usually **due by the 1st of each month**. Please see your bill for a range of payment options .

Occupied Property Reductions

Some occupied properties may be exempt (for example, where all the occupants are aged under 18).

A discount of 25% may be awarded if you are the sole adult resident (aged 18 or over) in the property.

A reduction may be possible if a resident is disabled and the property has certain features or facilities provided to meet their needs. The reduction takes the form of a drop in the valuation band (for example, from Band C to Band B).

A Council Tax Reduction (previously called Council Tax Benefit) may be available if you are on a low income. The amount awarded will depend on your household income, capital, personal circumstances and the amount of Council Tax payable.

Some discounts and reductions cannot be awarded on the water and sewerage element of your bill.

Unoccupied Properties

If your property is unoccupied you may be entitled to an exemption for a limited period.

If you are not entitled to an exemption and your property is long term empty you will have an extra charge levied which will double your council tax (see the back of your bill for more details or contact us for more information).

If you are not entitled to an exemption and your property is not long term empty you may get a discount (ranging between 10% and 50%).

Council Tax Charges 2021/22

Your home will fall within a Valuation Band between 'A' (the lowest) and 'H' (the highest) determined by the Assessor based on property values as at 1 April 1991.

The amount of Council Tax you pay is related to your Valuation Band. Higher banded properties pay a higher amount of Council Tax. Council Tax has been frozen from 1 April 2021 as agreed by the Comhairle.

The Scottish Average Band D Council Tax for 2020/21 was £1,308.

Appeals

You have the right of appeal if you disagree with your valuation band. In the first instance this should be discussed with the Assessor at 42 Point Street, Stornoway, HS1 2XF. (Telephone 01851 706262).

You also have the right of appeal on the grounds that you have been improperly charged. In the first instance this should be made in writing to the Revenues and Benefits Manager at the Stornoway Town Hall, Stornoway, HS1 2XF.

Capital Programme

Capital Expenditure is the cost of buying or upgrading physical assets such as property, infrastructure or equipment. Projects funded by capital expenditure are of long term benefit to the community and include schools, care homes and roads. 2021-22 is the fourth year of the 2018-23 Capital Programme. Major investments in 2021/22 will include:

- Lochmaddy pier improvements;
- Barra & Vatersay Community Campus project;
- Lewis Residential Care project;
- New cell at Bennadrove landfill site;
- Bernera Bridge replacement; and
- Provision of assistance to Community groups through the Community Capital Grant Scheme.

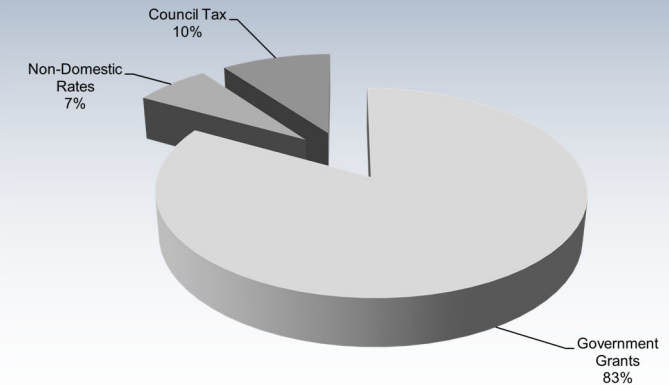

Only 10% of the Comhairle's spending is paid for by the Council Tax. The other 90% is funded by Government Grants and Non-Domestic Rates. In 2021/22, we expect to receive £93.9m in Government Grants, and £7.8m from the Non-Domestic Rates pool. £11.3m will come from Council Tax after allowing for Council Tax Reduction (formerly Council Tax Benefit).
