

REPORT BY HM INSPECTORS AND CARE INSPECTORATE – SGOIL LÌONAIL AND SGOIL ÀRAICH LÌONAIL APRIL 2024

Report by chief Officer for Education and Children's Services

PURPOSE

1.1 The purpose of the Report is to inform the Comhairle of the outcome of the inspection of Sgoil Lionail and Sgoil Àraich Lionail by Her Majesty's Inspectors from Education Scotland.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2.1 Sgoil Lionail and Sgoil Àraich Lionail were inspected by a team of HM Inspectors in January 2024 in a short model inspection. The Care Inspectorate also visited the Sgoil Àraich at the same time. The school received notice of 13 working days for the inspection and the team visited for three days.
- 2.2 Education Scotland published an inspection report in the form of a letter on 23rd April 2024. The letter sets out:
 - the school's key strengths and agreed areas for improvement;
 - evaluative judgements against quality indicators from Education Scotland for the school and sgoil àraich using a six-point scale;
 - signposting to the online summarised inspection findings (SIF) on Education Scotland's website, where further detail and recommendations are laid out.
- 2.4 Sgoil Lìonail was evaluated against quality indicators taken from *How Good is Our School?* 4th Edition (HGIOS4) and Sgoil Àraich Lìonail was evaluated against How Good Is Our Early Learning & Childcare (HGIOELC). The Care Inspectorate evaluated against A Quality Framework for Daycare of Children, Childminding and School Aged Childcare.
- 2.5 Upon conclusion of the inspection, the Executive Headteacher for Rural Primary Schools has commenced work with the staff of the school to develop and implement an action plan to address the agreed areas for improvement.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 3.1 It is recommended that the Comhairle:
 - (a) notes the Report: and
 - (b) Supports Sgoil Lìonail and Sgoil Àraich Lìonail to develop and implement an effective Action Plan which will address the areas for improvement within the HMI report.
